#### FAVORITE FOODS SHOW

The River Valley District is excited to offer a new, fun, and exciting opportunity for the 4-H'ers in our district – the Favorite Foods Show!

The Favorite Foods Show is a chance for youth to do something new in the Foods and Nutrition project! 4-H'ers will choose their favorite dish to create and eat – this is their Favorite Food. Then, they will plan an event where they will serve their dish, including a theme and the remaining menu for their event.

We will be hosting two Favorite Foods Show this June. 4-H'ers must be enrolled in the Foods and Nutrition project. A 4-H member may compete at either show, but not both.

4-H members will choose one show to compete at and will enter the contest by submitting the recipe for their Favorite Food to their local extension office by 4:30pm on Tuesday, May 31<sup>st</sup>. Entry forms can be found online at <http://www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/> under "Project Information".

At the show, 4-H members will serve their Favorite Food to the judge. Hot foods must be served hot and cold foods must be served cold! 4-H'ers must consider food safety when preparing their Favorite Food dish!

In addition to their Favorite Food, the 4-H'er will need to set a table for their event. They must include a menu with their Favorite Food underlined, a table setting for one, tablecloth, the recipe for their Favorite Food, and all serving utensils needed to serve their Favorite Food. Optional, 4-H'ers may add a place mat and centerpiece to coordinate with their event and theme!

To receive your premium and ribbon, 4-H'ers must exhibit at their local county fair. Their exhibit should include their table setting, menu, and recipe. It could also include their place mat, centerpiece, and photo of their Favorite Food!

## PIONEER TRAILS 4-H CAMP

The River Valley District is excited to be participating in Pioneer Trails 4-H Camp from Monday, June 20<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> at Rock Springs 4-H Center. 4-H and non-4-H youth are welcome to attend so invite a friend! Youth between 7 (4-H age as of January 1, 2016) and finishing 7th grade this spring are eligible to attend.

4-H Camp will cost \$175 (there may be an additional fee if transportation is provided). There will not be any extra charges for the shooting range or crafts, so the only additional money campers will need to bring is for any souvenirs or snacks they wish to buy. Check with your local RVD extension office for scholarship opportunities!

The last day to register for camp is Friday, May 20th. NO late registrations will be accepted. Registration forms are at all RVD extension offices or online at [www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/camp.html](http://www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/camp.html).

One update made to camp is that two additional lunches are included. Campers will eat lunch at Rock Springs on the first and last day of camp!

On the registration form, each camper can list two friends (near in age) that they wish to be grouped with. There is no guarantee that requests will be honored. For a better chance to be housed together, campers will need to list each other on their registration forms.

## LAST CHANCE FOR LIVESTOCK QUALITY ASSURANCE (LQA) TRAINING!

Have you attended an LQA training yet? The LQA training is required to sell livestock at the premium auction at your local fair in the RVD. All beef, swine, sheep and goat exhibitors are required to attend at least one class. Bucket calf, horse, and dairy exhibitors are strongly encouraged to attend. There is only one class left in the District:

## RIVER VALLEY DISTRICT JOINT FAIR DOG SHOW

River Valley District 4-H'ers in the Dog project will once again come together for the Joint Fair Dog Show. This year, the Joint Fair Dog Show will be hosted by Republic County on **Saturday, July 16 at the Commercial Building at the Fairgrounds in Belleville**. Registration begins at 8:00 am and the show will start at 9:00 am.

All dogs must have a current 4-H Dog Show Immunization Record that will be required this year to be turned in with your fair pre-entry forms. Due to the lower enrollment in this project, the rotating RVD Joint Dog Show has worked well the past two years. 4-H'ers in Clay, Cloud, Republic and Washington Counties will show their dogs together in the classes, but the judge will distribute their specific county ribbons and prizes to the 4-H'er when each county is called back into the show ring. Pictures will be taken of each 4-H'er to display at their county fair.

All are welcome—including those that are interested in Dog project and want to check out the show or those just interested in supporting other youth in the district!

### SHEEP/GOAT WEIGH-IN AND SWINE TAGGING

Below are the only remaining weigh-in and tagging times for market lambs, goats, and swine. If they are NOT tagged at one of these times they will NOT BE ELIGIBLE to show at the County Fair.

Please remember that Commercial Breeding Ewes, Gilts, and Does will need an EID tag for state livestock show nomination! Please bring those breeding animals to market weigh-in, so we can tag them at this time.

If you are NOT taking your breeding stock on to a state show, then an EID tag is NOT required and you do not have to bring them to weigh-in.

## POULTRY TESTING REQUIRED FOR FAIRS

As of December 2015, the poultry ban was lifted for the state of Kansas. For now, this means poultry will be allowed at our county fairs this year. However, in order for any birds to be able to participate in any of the county fairs, they must be tested for Pullorum-Typhoid and checked for lice. ALL poultry, including waterfowl, must be tested before being eligible for any county fair. The only bird exempt from testing is pigeons.

Two dates are set for testing. Birds may be tested at either location listed below. Together with the Kansas Department of Agriculture, the River Valley District has set the following times and dates for poultry testing:

Tuesday, July 12	Fairgrounds—Washington	5:30—6:30p.m.
Thursday, July 14	Fairgrounds—Belleville	8:00—10:00a.m.

## STATE GEOLOGY FIELD TRIP

The State 4-H Geology Field Trip will be held June 10-12, based in Minneola. Participants will collect Cretaceous through Quaternary rocks, minerals and fossils from the Champion Draw area of Kiowa County through the chalk beds of Gove County.

The state trip provide excellent opportunities for youth in the Geology project to learn more about the geology of Kansas, interact with trained geologists and geology leaders, go on collecting trips, participate in quiz bowl and judging contest events, and attend workshops.

Everyone attending the trips (adults and youth) must register online at [www.kansas4-h.org](http://www.kansas4-h.org). Detailed information about the trip will be posted on the [Geology Field Trip](#) page. Registration opens April 20, 2016 and will close on May 22, 2016. Three youth and 2 adults are registered for the River Valley District so far!

## FAIR ENTRY DEADLINES

Pre-fair entry forms will be sent to every 4-H member in the River Valley District. Fair Books will also be available for each 4-H Family. These entry forms are due to your local extension office on or before the date indicated below for your local county:

Clay County – Tuesday, June 14

Cloud County – Thursday, June 16

Republic County – Friday, July 1

Washington County – Monday, June 13

**Regarding Late Entries:** 4-H exhibitors that are late for pre-entry or late for fair check-in will be dropped one ribbon placing, are not eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion consideration, and are not eligible for any Overall Champion or Supreme Exhibitor consideration. Late pre-entry is defined as any pre-entry received after the local extension office closes on the pre-entry deadline up until the day before the designated judging of that area.

## ENTOMOLOGY/GEOLOGY FAIR PROJECTS

The River Valley District will have all Entomology and Geology exhibits for your local county fair judged at one time again. This year, the judging will be held at the 4-H Conference Center at the Clay County Fairgrounds in Clay Center on Friday, July 15th from 1-4p.m.

While consultation judging will be held at the same location and time, exhibits will only compete against others in the same county. Ribbons and awards will still be awarded at your local county fair and youth must exhibit their project at their local county fair to be eligible for premiums and ribbons.

After all fair entries have been received, a judging schedule will be sent to all 4-H'ers with an Entomology or Geology project. This schedule should arrive around July 8th.

## SHOOTING SPORTS

The Shooting Sports Project is winding down for the year!

Due to having to cancel two practice shoots due to bad weather, 4-H members must only complete three practice shoots before being eligible to participate in the Fair Shoot.

There are two shoots left for the year. Both sessions will be held at the Cloud County Fairgrounds with youth from Washington and Clay Counties beginning at 2pm and youth from Republic and Cloud Counties starting at 3pm.

**Sunday, May 22nd**—Youth may use this as a practice shoot. If a youth has attended three practice shoots prior to this date, a 4-H'er can designate this date as their Fair Shoot.

**Sunday, June 5th**—Fair Shoot only for youth that have completed three practice shoots and have not participated in a Fair Shoot yet.

Once arriving, youth must check-in at the Commercial Building before going to do ANY shooting.

## FAIR RIBBONS

With the fairs quickly approaching, here are some reminders of how ribbons are awarded at the county fairs!

- All exhibits will receive a ribbon unless it is disqualified by the judge for any reason
- Exhibits are judged in comparison with an ideal standard—not to another exhibit
- Exhibits are placed in 4 ribbon groups:
  - PURPLE: Outstanding on all standards
  - BLUE: Exceeds the minimum standard; may have minor flaws where improvements can be made
  - RED: Meets all minimum standards; may be visible signs of needed improvements
  - WHITE: Fails to meet minimum standards

Good luck to all of our 4-H'ers that will be participating at their respective county fair this summer! We are excited to see all that our 4-H'ers have been working on throughout the year!
