#### **Pre-Fair Entry Deadlines**

Everything that a 4-H member wants to exhibit at their local county fair MUST be included on their fair entry form! Entry forms will be sent to every 4-H member in the River Valley District. Fair books will also be available for each 4-H family. These entry forms are due to your local extension office on or before the date indicated below for your local fair:

**Regarding Late Entries:** Late pre-entry is defined as any pre-entry received after the local extension office closes on the pre-entry deadline up until the day before the designated judging of that area. 4-H exhibitors that are late for pre-entry or late for fair checkin will be dropped one ribbon placing, are not eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion consideration, and are not eligible for any Overall Champion or Supreme Exhibitor consideration.

Upon arriving at the fairgrounds, 4-H'ers must check-in at the Commercial Building before going to do <u>ANY</u> shooting. RVD-Clay Center and RVD-Washington 4-H'ers begin their shoots at 2:00 p.m. RVD-Belleville and RVD-Concordia 4-H'ers start at 3:00 p.m.

## Two Opportunities Remain for Sheen/Goat Weigh-Ins & Swine Tagging

Below are the only remaining two tagging dates for market sheep, goat, and swine and state nominated commercial breeding sheep, goat, and swine. If animals were NOT tagged at one of the four district taggings, they will NOT BE ELIGIBLE to show at the County Fair.

Please remember that Commercial Breeding Ewes, Gilts, and Does need an EID tag for state livestock show nomination! Please bring those breeding animals to market weigh in, so we can tag them at this time. If you are NOT planning on taking your breeding stock on to a state show, then an EID tag is NOT required and you do not have to bring them to weighin.

Reminder that there will be no home tagging, even if only attending a state nominated livestock show. A district extension agent must be present at the time of tagging.

Livestock Home Tagging is NOT Allowed		

Home tagging of livestock will NOT be allowed this year for Sheep, Swine, Meat Goats, Beef, or Commercial Breeding livestock.

Exhibitors may weigh-in and/or tag at any of the four counties within the River Valley District.

Swine will not be weighed in this year. However, swine will need to be brought to weigh in for tagging purposes.

Please bring Commercial Breeding animals to weigh in if you are planning on attending a state show, i.e. Kansas

# LAST Chance for Livestock Quality Assurance (LOA)

Livestock Quality Assurance (LQA) is required to show live- The LAST chance to attend LQA will be on Saturday, May stock at the county fairs in the RVED.

All beef, swine, sheep, and goat exhibitors are required to hibitors are strongly encouraged to attend but not required. one day prior to the training. Parents are encouraged to attend as well.

# **Poultry Testing Required**

All poultry, EXCEPT for waterfowl and pigeons, must be tested for Pullorum-Typhoid and checked for lice before being eligible to be exhibited at a county fair. Birds in the River Valley District can be tested at either location provided below in conjunction with KDA:

- Monday, July 10th Washington Fairgrounds 5:30pm-6:30pm
- Thursday, July 13th **Belleville Fairgrounds** 8:30am-9:30am

## Fair Ribbon Placings

All exhibits at the fair will receive a placing and ribbon unless it is disqualified by the judge for any reason. Judge's decision is final. Exhibits are judged in comparison with an ideal standards and are not compared to another exhibit.

- **Purple**—Outstanding in all standards
- **Blue**—Exceeds the minimum standard but may have minor flaws where improvements can be made
- **Red**—Meets all minimum standards but may have visible signs of needed improvements
- White—fails to meet minimum standards

Good luck to all of our 4-H'ers that will be participating at their respective county fair this summer! We are excited to see all of the projects that our 4-H'ers have been working on this year!

Did you know that if your photo is incorrectly mounted, it will automatically be lowered one ribbon placing? This is something that could be easily avoided! 4-H families that would like to learn how to correctly mount photos are welcome to attend any photography mounting workshop across the River Valley District!

A small fee may be charged for each picture mounted to cover the cost of supplies. Mounting boards are available for \$1.00 each at all River Valley District offices.
