Fair Pre-Entry Deadlines

All projects that a 4-H member wants to exhibit at their local county fair MUST be pre-entered on their fair entry form. Entry forms will be sent to every 4-H member in the River Valley District with their enrolled projects list. Fairbooks are available online at https://www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html.

Fair entry forms are due to your local extension office on or before the date indicated below for your local county fair.

RVD - Cloud - Friday, June 11

RVD - Clay - Monday, June 21

RVD - Washington - Monday, June 21

RVD - Republic - Thursday July 1

There are no penalties if you do not bring something you pre-enter. Please try to minimize the number of entry scratches by carefully considering what projects you will be able to complete. We use the number of pre-entries to schedule judging times, so excessive scratches causes our schedules to be off. However, there are penalties for late pre-entries. Late pre-entry is defined as any pre-entry received after the local extension office closed on the pre-entry deadline day. 4-H exhibitors that are late for pre-entry will be dropped one ribbon placing.

Premium Auction Requirements

To be eligible to participate in the Fair Livestock Premium Sale/Project Auctions, each member MUST complete the three requirements that was established by the Joint of County Fair Boards back in October.

Attend a "minimum" of 3 Club Meetings

Complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

Participate in 2 approved activities that are listed on the form

The Fair Livestock Premium Sale/Project Auction Requirement form can be found on the RVD website https://www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html scroll down to fair forms. This form must be signed by your community leader and turned into the extension office by June 30th.

YQGA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is required if a 4-H/FFA member plans to sell a market animal in the Livestock Auction at the fair. This course can be taken either by attending a face to face session put on by an extension staff member or taking the online course. The 4-H/FFA member must sign up and pay by logging into http://yqca.org in person course is \$3 – online course \$12

The 2021 wheat expo will be one of Kansas 4-H's first face-to-face state 4-H events since COVID-19 shut down physical/face-to-face 4-H programming in March 2020. We are excited to bring the wheat expo back for a fun, educational and hands-on program in person for all Kansas 4-H members, siblings, parents, grandparents, and KSRE Extension staff.

The Kansas 4-H State Wheat Expo is a wheat fun day showcasing all things wheat. Join us for the annual event in early August tentatively scheduled in Wichita-area. Full date and location details will be announced by June 1st. There will be eight contests open to youth members with cash prizes and ribbons awarded.

Cost will be \$6.00 per person registration cost for using the CVent registration system. Registration will go live by June 15th. Pre-registration will be required by Sunday, August 1st, 11:59 p.m. to ensure an accurate meal count and for tour divisions. 2021 – 22 Kansas 4-H and FFA Wheat Variety Plot Enrollment

As wheat harvest approaches it is time to remind members to re-enroll or ask new members to enroll for the 2022 Kansas 4-H and FFA Wheat Variety Plot program. The program begins fall of 2021 and goes through September 2022. The enrollment form and program details will be updated by May 1st. Members are asked to contact their local Extension Office by July 12th for information with enrollments due to Deryl Waldren, dwaldren@ksu.edu by July 23, 2021.

There will be no cost for the program in 2021-22 since the five varieties are again being sponsored by commercial companies. It is very important that we know the number of participants early, so we can have enough seed and metal signs available for Extension agents and leaders to pick up at the Kansas State Fair. New participants will receive a free large plot sign, and five free individual variety signs. These are scheduled to be distributed in early September. Details are still to be determined.

Don't forget to pull your wheat samples for the Kansas State 4-H Wheat Show in early August in Wichita, and also for wheat samples at your county fair, that may be eligible for the Kansas State Fair 4-H Crops Division.
