## More Info on the Jr. Leader Educational Trip to Milwaukee

Will you be one of the 48 Jr. Leaders that attend the 2019 Jr. Leader Educational Trip to Milwaukee, Wisconsin?

The trip will be taking place Tuesday, August 6<sup>th</sup> through Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and is open to 4-H members who will complete the 8<sup>th</sup> grade in 2019 through youth 4-H age 18. Youth must also be enrolled in the Leadership Project to attend.

Tentative highlights include:

- Cave of the Mounds—a geologic wonder with spectacular crystallized rock formations
- *Harley-Davidson Museum*—history roars to life with all the H-D motorcycles
- Discovery World—unique, hands-on exhibits and programs focusing on technology and freshwater sciences
- North Point Lighthouse—a lighthouse standing over Lake Michigan for over 150 years
- Bradford Beach—swimming at a Lake Michigan beach
- John Deere Museum—explore interactive displays, marvel at classic machines, and get an up-close look at rare John Deere artifacts

Other tentative highlights of the trip include a tour of Root Beer Facility and a Cheese Factory with tastings, touring a Wastewater Treatment plant and learning how wastewater is returned to Lake Michigan, and a sightseeing boat tour of Milwaukee.

More details, including exact cost and a full itinerary will be available soon and shared with the eligible Jr. Leaders in the River Valley District. The cost will be between \$400-\$500 per youth. Scholarships may be available through your local 4-H entities and fundraising opportunities will be offered to those who attend.

Registration will be completed online only for this trip. The trip will be filled on a first come, first served basis by time of registration completed with 12 seats allotted for each office in the River Valley District. On Friday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, we will notify the first 48 youth that registered for the trip that their \$100 deposit will be required within one week to secure their spot.

## Livestock Weigh-In/Tagging Dates

It's almost time for livestock weigh-in and tagging in the River Valley District! You may choose to tag/weigh your livestock at any of the offered times for that specie in the River Valley District.

No tagging will be allowed to be completed at home for any species, for any reason. All tagging must be completed at one of the following dates and times with a district extension agent present!

**2019 Beef Weigh-In**—All Market Beef, state nominated Commercial Breeding Heifers, and Second Year Bucket Calves must be tagged at a RVD weigh-in/tagging. Commercial Breeding Heifers must have an EID tag for state livestock shows, including Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Registered Breeding Heifers for state shows do not need an EID. Breeding stock for your county fair do not need an EID.

**2019 Sheep, Goat and Swine Weigh-in/Tagging**— All Market Sheep, Goats, and Swine for the county fairs, as well as Commercial Breeding Sheep, Goats, and Swine for state shows, must be tagged at a RVD weigh-in/tagging. Registered Breeding Sheep and Swine do not need EID tags.

### Youth for the Quality Care of Animals—YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, YQCA, is the livestock quality assurance program that is required to sell livestock in the premium auction at your local county fair and to participate in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Jr. Livestock Show. A current and valid Youth PQA certification will be accepted until they expire.

YQCA offers in-person and online training for youth age 8-18. Youth 4-H age 7 must attend an in-person training. Online and in-person training must be completed by June 15, 2019. The in-person training is \$3 per youth while the online course is \$12 per youth.

New for this year, YQCA is offering a test-out option only for youth 4-H age 12 and 15. The training must be completed online and pay for the multiple years in which they are testing out. More information will be shared with eligible youth at the beginning of the 2019 Year.

#### State 4-H Scholarships

Each year, Kansas 4-H Foundation and its donors provide scholarships to excelling 4-H members. All current 4-H members who are seniors and will be attending college and those past 4-H members who are attending college are encouraged to complete the scholarship application.

The 2019 Scholarship Application can be found on our River Valley District 4-H website at <a href="www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/scholarships.html">www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/scholarships.html</a> or it may be picked up at your local River Valley District Extension Office.

There are 8 steps to complete the Kansas 4-H Scholarship application. Please follow the steps carefully and assemble it in the correct order.

You will need the following:

- 1. Completed Kansas 4-H Scholarship application
- 2. Transcript—high school or college, whichever is most appropriate
- 3. Letter of Recommendation high school or college personnel
- 4. Letter of Recommendation 4-H leader or Extension staff
- 5. One page list of 4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition
- 6. One page essay on how "4-H has impacted me"
- 7. One page list of non-4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition in school and community

8. Short paragraph about educational and long-term career goals

Don't wait until the last minute. Ask for letters of recommendation as early as possible to be considerate of others and their busy schedules!

A lot of the information will be on your permanent record *IF* you kept it up to date correctly, including your participation, leadership, citizenship and recognition.

Good luck to all River Valley District 4-H members! Completed applications and all supporting materials are due back to your local River Valley District Extension Office by Wednesday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 so we are able to deliver scholarship applications to K-State by the deadline.
