16 4-H Members Attend Citizenship in Action (CIA)

Sixteen 4-H members and three chaperones from the River Valley District attended Kansas 4-H Citizenship in Action in Topeka at the Capital Plaza Hotel on Sunday and Monday, February 17th and 18th. CIA is a State 4-H Event for young people to learn about the legislative process.



Sunday afternoon, attendees were split in committees to work together to write three different mock bills that would later be debated and voted on in mock sessions. The mock bill on Veteran benefits was debated and voted on at the hotel prior to the banquet.

Sunday evening, 4-H'ers attended a formal banquet with Representatives Suzi Carlson, District 64, and Bill Pannbacker, District 106, as guests of River Valley District 4-H. Vicki Schmidt, Kansas Insurance Commissioner, was the guest speaker and shared a fascinating story regarding overcoming a failure.

Following the banquet, the 4-H members headed to the Capitol building to debate and vote on the remaining two mock bills regarding the Ogallala Aquifer

and opioid restriction in the House of Representatives Chamber. While one group was debating on the bills, the other group were completing a scavenger hunt on Kansas history and legislative knowledge. The evening concluded back at the hotel with dancing, swimming, and playing board games.

On Monday morning, 4-H members attended a buffet breakfast with Wade Weber, State 4-H Program Leader, charging those in attendance to make a difference in their communities. 4-H members donated various items to the Ronald McDonald House in Topeka. Mindee Reece, their Executive Director, thanked the group for their generosity and addressed exactly what their organization does for families, which included families from Clay, Cloud, and Washington Counties in 2018.

The delegation then headed to the Capitol to meet with legislators, observe committee meetings and legislative sessions, and tour the Capitol. Senator Elaine Bowers, District 36, took time out of her busy day to meet with our 4-H members in her office and showed the youth around.

CIA was a great opportunity for youth to witness the legislative process in action, participate in mock sessions, promote 4-H to our legislators, and to learn the difference one can make with their state government. Consider attending next year!

Horse Identification Certificates Due May 1st

4-H & FFA Members participating in the Horse Project must have **ANY** horse identified they intend on exhibiting at their County Fair and/or the NCK District Horse Show by returning a completed Horse Identification Certificate to their local River Valley Extension District Office by Wednesday, **MAY 1st**.

This form can be picked up at any River Valley Extension District Office or found online at www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html.

You may identify as many horses as you may show. There is no penalty to identify a horse that you do not use. It is always a good idea to have additional horses identified in the case of an injury, etc.

This form requires a member, parent, owner (if leased), and extension agent signature. Also required is a colored picture, including all four (4) feet/legs, and horse's head turned towards the camera. This photo should be at-

tached to the form.

The original identification form and picture must be kept by the 4-H'ers or FFA members. Each year, you will submit the same ID form for a signature to identify the horse for that year and a copy will be taken for our records.

The copy will be kept in the extension office until September 30th, 2019. After the completion of the current 4-H Year, copies of Horse ID Forms will be shredded.

You may be required to show your original ID forms at show check-in. Horses identified after May 1st or horses without proper ID certificates cannot show.

North Central Kansas District Horse Show

The North Central Kansas District Horse Show is the qualifying event for the Kansas State Fair. The NCK District Horse Show will be held on Monday, July 1st in Salina.

Level 1—Horse Level Testing, which includes a written and riding exam, must be passed by June 1st to be eligible to participate in the District Horse Show. If you are interested in completing Horse Level Testing, contact your local River Valley Extension District Office as soon as possible.

Entries will also be due by Saturday, June 1st. We will share the entry website once it is available.

YQCA—Youth for the Quality Care of Animals

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, YQCA, is the livestock quality assurance program that is required to sell livestock in the premium auction at your local county fair and/or to participate in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Jr. Livestock Show. A current and valid Youth PQA certification will be accepted until they expire.

A video tutorial, link to the YQCA website, list of valid PQA certifications, and dates for our YQCA instructor-led trainings can be found on our website here: www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html.

YQCA offers instructor-led and web-based training for youth 4-H age 8-18. Web-based and instructor-led training must be completed by Saturday, June 15, 2019. To either register for an instructor-led training or complete the web-based training, you must register through the YQCA website. The link is on our website that is listed above. The instructor-led training is \$3 per youth while the web-based training is \$12 per youth.

Youth 4-H age 7 must attend an in-person training. There is no cost for a youth 4-H age 7 to attend. To register a youth 4-H age 7 only, you must call our RVD-Concordia office at 785-243-8185.

Mark these dates on your calendar for the instructor-led training in the River Valley District! In addition to these dates and times, youth can attend instructor-led training at events, like Junior Producer Days and Discovery Days.

Livestock Weigh-In/Tagging Dates

It's almost time for weigh-in and tagging for county fair livestock in the River Valley District! You may choose to tag/weigh your livestock at any of the offered times for that specie in the River Valley District.

No tagging will be allowed to be completed at home for any species, for any reason. All tagging must be completed at one of the following dates and times with a district extension agent present!

2019 Beef Weigh-In—All Market Beef, Second Year Bucket Calves, and state nominated Commercial Breeding Heifers must be tagged at a RVD weigh-in/tagging. Commercial Breeding Heifers must have an EID tag for state livestock shows, including Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Registered Breeding Heifers for state shows do not need an EID. Breeding stock for your county fair do not need an EID.

Please note the date change from Sunday, March 3rd to Sunday, March 10th for our Belleville and Concordia times due to the predicted weather. With this change, if your family is unable to attend one of these tagging times for Beef, please contact Brett at 785-243-8185.

2019 Sheep, Goat and Swine Weigh-in/Tagging— All Market Sheep, Goats, and Swine for the county fairs, as well as Commercial Breeding Sheep, Goats, and Swine for state shows, must be tagged at a RVD weigh-in/tagging. Registered Breeding Sheep and Swine do not need EID tags.

Beef EID tags will be \$4 per tag. Sheep, Goat, and Swine EID tags will be \$3 per tag. Payment is required at the time of tagging so please bring small bills or a check payable to the River Valley Extension District.

Bucket Calves

A bucket calf is such a fun project for youth 4-H age of 7-12 years old! The 4-H'er learns responsibility as they bottle feed and care for a baby calf.

Bucket calves must be born between January 1 and April 30, 2019. Exhibitor must own and be in possession of their bucket calf by May 1st.

Bucket calves must be tagged with an official 4-H tag available at your local extension office for \$3.00. The 4-H Bucket Calf Identification Form is available at your local River Valley Extension District Office or can be found online at www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html. This form is due with your pre-fair entry form on your county's fair entry deadlines.

When fair time rolls around the exhibitor needs to be prepared to talk to the judge about all the fun learning experiences they had with that cute calf, as well as, be ready for showmanship in the show ring.

The Bucket Calf Practice and Interview Record is also available on the website mentioned earlier to assist youth as they prepare for the fair.

Once fair books are available, make sure you read the rules in the fair book for more information.

Project Entry Deadline May 1st

Don't forget to check out your 4-H Online profile at www.4honline.com before Wednesday, May 1st to ensure the 4-H members in your family are enrolled in the correct projects!!

The projects that youth are enrolled in as of May 2nd are what they are eligible to participate in at their county fair! Do not wait until after the May 1st deadline because you will be too late!

If you need assistance with your account or with adding or dropping any projects, please contact your 4-H Program Manager!

Shooting Sports

If you want inclement weather, it appears that all you have to do is schedule a Shooting Sports event! As hard as we try, we can't seem to pick a date with good weather!

We have rescheduled our dates for Safety Meetings to Sunday, March 17th and Sunday, March 24th – both to start at 1 p.m. with a practice shoot to follow the training at the Cloud County Fairgrounds. Remember, a parent/guardian **MUST** accompany youth to the Safety Meeting, and all paperwork and fees must be completed and paid before a youth can participate in a practice shoot.

If your child wants to participate in Shooting Sports but can't make the two weekends we have scheduled for the Safety Meetings, please contact your local 4-H Program Manager as soon as possible to discuss other options.

With all the cancellations, we have lowered the requirement to be eligible to participate in a fair shoot to the safety meeting and participate in one practice shoot in each discipline. Additional practice shoots will be held on Sunday, April 7th.

Once they have completed their requirements, youth may designate either the following dates as their Fair Shoot – Sunday, May 5th or Sunday, June 9th. Note: May 5th can also be used as a practice shoot.

Hopefully, we will have nicer weather, but in case of inclement weather and we have to cancel a shoot, watch for an e-mail. You can also check out the River Valley 4-H Facebook page, or listen to your local radio station.

Kansas 4-H Award Portfolio Screening

Six River Valley District 4-H'ers sent 12 Kansas 4-H Award Portfolios (KAPs) to the NE Area KAP Screening on January 31, in Manhattan. A team of two evaluators, from different extension units, read through, discussed, and made comments on each KAP.

The top two KAPs in each project area are selected to advance on to the state judging. Those 4-H'ers have the opportunity to make any corrections on their KAP from the feedback from the evaluators. Each finalist is encouraged to submit a five-minute video based on their knowledge and experience in the project area.

Hazardous Occupations Training Offered

Federal Law requires youth ages 14 and 15 to participate in a Hazardous Occupations Training and become certified in order to work for hire for anyone other than their parents. Youth **must pass** a safe tractor and machinery operation program to be certified.

To meet this requirement, the River Valley District will be conducting the Hazardous Occupations Training/ tractor and machinery safety training. The training provides trainees with knowledge of tractor, machinery, and other farm hazards to reduce the farm accident rate. It also provides sufficient information to pass a written examination and an opportunity to demonstrate their ability to pass a safe tractor driving examination.

The training will be held on Saturday, May 11, 2019

from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm at PrairieLand Partners (formerly CTI) in Concordia. Youth must pre-register by Monday, April 29, 2019 by contacting any River Valley District Extension office. Cost of the course is \$20, which includes materials and refreshments. Youth must bring a sack lunch.

Youth **must** provide *name, address, date of birth, and contact information*; as well as pay the fee at registration time. Youth **must complete assignments before coming to class, attend the entire day, and then complete a driving requirement** in order to **receive certification**. One rule change that affects all four counties. In the Livestock divisions, we have removed the Club Herd, Club Flock, Pen of Five, etc. competitions due to lack of participation, logistics, and safety of animals and youth.
