Premium Auction Requirements

All 4-H and FFA members that are planning on participating in your county Livestock Premium Sale or Project Auction must complete the following requirements:

- Attend a minimum of 3 Club Meetings
- Complete the YQCA training either in person or online
- Participate in 3 approved activities listed on the District Form

If you need help to mount your fair photos, first print your photos out as an 8 x 10 (can be cut down no smaller than 7" x 9". You should purchase your mounting boards from the extension office for \$1.00 each. The mounting board should always be in the portrait position and measure down 1" from the top and center the picture in the middle.
