Applications, cover letters, and resumes will be due with District 4-H Club Day entries on January 4th. The interviews will take place during District 4-H Club Day on Saturday, February 6th via zoom. 4-H Volunteers

Beginning in the 2019-2020 4-H program year, the 4-H Volunteer process was modified and streamlined. When you, as an adult 4-H Volunteer, enroll through 4-HOnline, the process will take place of what was prior the paper volunteer application. Once you enter your information in the system this year, you will simply have to reenroll each year (<u>https://v2.4honline.com</u>). As you complete your 4-HOnline profile, please remember to complete **ALL** sections, including what project areas you are willing to volunteer with.

If you are a returning 4-H Volunteer and have completed a criminal background check (CBC) within the last 3 years, this may be all you have to do! Your local 4-H Program Manager will contact you if additional information is needed.

If you are a **first year** 4-H Volunteer, your local 4-H Program Manager will be contacting you regarding completing a CBC and additional training that may need to be completed.

Thank you to all of the current River Valley District 4-H Volunteers! The impact a 4-H Volunteer has is truly priceless. While the RVD has been fortunate to have wonderful volunteers, there is a constant need for more adults to lead our 4-H youth!

Take a moment to think about what skills and passions you possess that you could share with 4-H youth. Maybe you have a neighbor, family member, teacher, etc., who would be a great volunteer with 4-H. Help us recruit them to assist with our youth development program! You can share with them the enrollment process or they can contact your local 4-H Program Manager to discuss volunteer options.

State 4-H Scholarships

Each year, Kansas 4-H Foundation and its donors give numerous scholarships to excelling 4-H members. All current 4-H members who are seniors and will be attending college and those past 4-H members who are attending college are encouraged to complete the scholarship application. We are waiting on State 4-H to release the 2021 version of the scholarship. Once it is available, we will post it on our River Valley District 4-H website at www.rivervalley.k-state.edu/4-h/scholarship.html or it may be picked up at your local River Valley District Extension Office. In the past, these have been the 8 steps to complete the Kansas 4-H Scholarship application. We do not foresee any changes but will update our eligible members once the applications are released. Please follow the steps carefully and assemble it in the correct order. You will need the following:

- 1. Completed Kansas 4-H Scholarship application.
- 2. Transcript.
- 3. Letter of Recommendation high school or college personnel.
- 4. Letter of Recommendation 4-H leader or Extension staff.
- 5. One-page list of 4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition.
- 6. One-page essay on how "4-H has impacted me."

7. One-page list of non-4-H leadership, community service, participation, and recognition in school and community.

8. Short paragraph about educational and long-term career goals.

Don't wait until the last minute. Ask for letters of recommendation as early as possible to be considerate of others and their busy schedules!

A lot of the information will be on your permanent record IF you kept it up to date correctly, including your participation, leadership, citizenship and recognition.

Good luck to all River Valley District 4-H members! Completed applications and all supporting materials are due back to your local River Valley District Extension Office by January 18, 2021 so we are able to deliver scholarship applications to K-State by the deadline.

Shooting Sports

River Valley District 4-H offers five Shooting Sports disciplines – **BB Gun, Air Rifle, Archery, Small Bore Rifle (22), and Shot Gun**. We host all Shooting Sports Safety Meetings, Practice Shoots, and Fair Shoots at the Cloud County Fairgrounds (East of Concordia – Just south of the intersection of Industrial Road and Kansas Highway 9). This year, all Safety Meetings and Registrations will take place in the Hosie Building.

Eligibility & Requirements

Per National and State 4-H Bylaws, enrolled 4-H members between the 4-H ages of 8 to 18 (before January 1st, 2021) are eligible to participate in Shooting Sports. Kansas 4-H competitive age is 9 (before January 1st, 2021), a state event or state qualifying match. Youth must be enrolled in the project through 4-HOnline and attend a safety meeting. Our Shooting Sports instructors may determine if youth are developmentally able to participate in each discipline. A parent/guardian **MUST** accompany youth to each discipline at each shoot.

Safety Meetings

Our coordinator and instructors host two safety meetings each year. All participating 4-H'ers **MUST** attend one of these two safety meeting before they can participate in Shooting Sports. A parent/guardian **MUST** accompany youth to the Safety Meeting. Completing paperwork for Shooting Sports will occur after the safety meeting and all youth may shoot following the completion of their paperwork and payment received.

Registration & Sign-In

Each day Shooting Sports events are held, youth **MUST check-in** with our volunteers at the Hosie Building before going to any discipline. When you check-in, you will receive a name tag. You must have this name tag on before any instructor will allow you to participate. Once you have completed your disciplines for the day, you MUST check-out at the Hosie Building. **Failing to check-in and/or -out will result in no credit for that shoot.**

At each discipline, instructors will have a sign-in sheet. After practicing that discipline, instructors will have youth sign-in acknowledging participation. Failing to sign-in at each discipline will result in no credit for that shoot.

*May 2nd will be a make-up date for any previously cancelled shoots due to weather.

To help alleviate the waiting times at the disciplines, we have implemented a time schedule. These times are for Practice and Fair Shoot dates only. Safety Meetings will begin promptly at 1:00 p.m. with shooting following immediately for all youth. The last time for check-in will be 2:30 p.m. Youth will **NOT** be allowed to participate if they check-in after this time.

RVD Clay County & RVD Cloud County1:00 p.m.RVD Republic County & RVD Washington County2:00 p.m.

Fair Shoot

To participate in the Fair Shoot, each 4-H'er must complete FOUR regular practice shoots in each discipline prior to the Fair Shoot. If this requirement is not met, youth may still participate in the Fair Shoot, but will be dropped one ribbon place per discipline in which the four practice shoot requirement is not met.

Once they have completed their requirements, youth may designate either of the following two dates as their Fair Shoot. However, once youth have designated a Fair Shoot day, they will not be able to change that date. Youth are NOT able to complete a practice shoot and the Fair Shoot on the same day.

Sunday, May 23rd, 2021 (Fair Shoot #1 OR Practice Shoot) Sunday, June 13th, 2021 (Fair Shoot #2)

County Champions

Results from the Fair Shoot will be displayed at your local county fair. In order to be eligible to be a county champion, 4-H'ers must participate in the following throughout the year and at the Fair Shoot:

Seniors (14-18 4-H age) must do four out of the five disciplines Juniors (8-13 4-H age) must do three out of the five disciplines

If a 4-H'er chooses to do all disciplines at the Fair Shoot, only their top scores will be used. The lowest discipline score (s) will be dropped. (*Example*: A 10-year-old 4-H'er competes in all five disciplines. She does best at Archery, Shot Gun, and BB Gun. These three scores are used to calculate her overall score. Her two lowest scores are not used to calculate her overall score for County Champion consideration.)

Fees

Shooting Sports fees help cover the expenses of materials, instructor training, etc. The total cost due per 4-H member will depend on which disciplines the 4-H'er is participating in. If they want to participate in all disciplines, the total cost due is \$25. All fees **MUST** be paid prior to youth participating in their first shoot.

\$5 for combination of Archery, BB, and Air Rifle \$5 for Small Bore Rifle (22) \$15 for Shotgun

NOTE: If your 4-H'er was enrolled and paid to participate in Shooting Sports during the 2019-2020 4-H year, this year's fees will be waived due to the many cancellations of COVID-19.

<u>Shooting Sports – Trap Team</u>

In addition to the general 4-H Shooting Sports disciplines, River Valley District 4-H offers a Trap Team. Trap Team shoots 50 clays from 5 trap pads 16 yards behind the thrower. The Trap Team Shoots are held at the Cloud County Fairgrounds (East of Concordia – Just south of the intersection of Industrial Road and Kansas Highway 9).

Eligibility & Requirements

Enrolled 4-H members between the 4-H ages of 8 - 18 (before January 1st, 2021) are eligible to participate in the Trap Team, but must also be enrolled in Shooting Sports – Shot Gun on 4-HOnline and a paid and bona fide member of the Shooting Sports Shot Gun discipline. Our Shooting Sports instructors may determine if youth are developmentally able to participate on the Trap Team.

Shoots

Trap Team Shoots will be held after the completion of the regular Shooting Sports practice and fair shoots. Additional times may be scheduled at different times by the instructors. The State Qualifying Matches will be held over the summer in varying locations, and the River Valley District will host a State Shot Gun Qualifying Shoot on Saturday, August 14th, 2021. The State Trap Shoot being held in October 2021. Youth must be 4-H age 13-18 to participate in the State Trap Shoot competition.

Fees & Equipment

In addition to being a paid member of the Shot Gun discipline, youth must pay \$15 to participate on the Trap Team and must provide their own shells for every shoot.

Weather

If we have to cancel a shoot due to weather, we will put an announcement on area radio stations, send an e-mail to all 4-H families with youth enrolled in Shooting Sports, and post it on the "River Valley 4-H" Facebook page. If you hear of a cancellation, please help us by contacting fellow 4-H members with the news!
